Dear Parents and Guardians,

I would like to start this first newsletter for the year with a welcome to all students and their families, with a special mention to our 2017 Preps, whose first day was today, and all the new families who have moved to our school this year. The year has started smoothly thanks to the efforts of our amazing staff, who came in during the holidays to set up their classrooms and prepare for the students arrival.

I would also like to welcome the following staff members who have joined the Melton West Primary School community this year: Ms Sherri Brezina as our fulltime First Aid Officer, Mallory Bland and Paul Cathro in the Prep Department, Charlene Waldron to the 1/2 team, Emma Keyes, Joanne Agius, and Katie Hawke to the 3/4 team and Kate Bytheway and Kerri Fraser to the 5/6 team. I would also like to welcome back Jacinta Thunell after a year teaching at another school.

This year, as always, looks like it's going to be an action-packed year. Some of the major things that we will be working on include our **School Review**. This occurs every 4 years and involves a thorough evaluation about what we have been doing over the past 4 years, scrutinising our data and then developing plans for the next 4 years. It will be important to seek feedback from all members of our school community, including parents and children and we look forward to inviting you to be an active part of this process.

Another major project that we are hoping will come to fruition is the development and implementation of our **Master Plan**. Last year we were one of the schools that were mentioned in the May Budget to create a Master Plan to upgrade our school and included the construction of a gymnasium. We were very excited to hear this news and worked closely with the architecture firm we appointed to create this. They spoke with parents, teachers and students about what they saw as a need and incorporated that into our initial plan. We were then informed that we were selected to be part of a pilot project 80/20 which means 80% of our buildings will be permanent, with 20% relocatable. I will be attending a meeting next Tuesday to discuss the Schematic Design, which I think is the next stage in the process. The actual commencement of starting our Master Plan is yet to be confirmed. We need to wait until the next May Budget to see if we have been allocated funds to start Stage 1. I will keep you informed of where we are up to.

I thought it would be important to remind our community of our School Values and how they are reflected in the behavioural expectations of all. The Melton West PS values are **Communication, Respect, Teamwork** and **Trust**. The following table outlines what we have agreed each value means and how we all, staff, parents and students, should demonstrate it.

Other important information for this newsletter:

Camps, Sports and Excursion Funds (CSEF): Students of families, who have an eligible Health Care Card, can apply for a grant from the Government of \$125. Please bring your current Health Care Card to the office and complete the form.

Parent Helpers Expression of Interest: We value the role parents have played in their child's life, as their first teacher. We would like to encourage parents to continue to be an active member of their child's educational journey. There are many ways you can be involved in the school and we have created a form for parents to indicate how they may like to assist. We have tried to provide an indication of the time commitment involved to help you gauge whether it is something you can commit to. We look forward to meeting many new parents and encourage all parents to be involved, if they can spare an hour or so.

Coffee Club: This year we are inviting all parents to come to our Coffee Club, which will be held every second week. See dates on the front calendar and more information on the next page in the newsletter. This is an opportunity to meet other parents and staff, for informal chats and connections.

Meet the Teacher Interviews: On Wednesday 15th February we invite all parents and carers to a “Meet the Teacher” Interview. This is an opportunity for you to talk to the teachers about your child so that they can best meet the needs of your child. Please take the opportunity to attend, even if it’s just to introduce yourself.

Extend OSHC: We have a Before and After School Care Program that families are encouraged to use if they need to get their child to school very early – before 8.30 or need care afterschool. Yard duty finishes at 3.15 each day, so children should be cleared from the playground by then, unless they are with an adult.

ICT Acceptable Use Agreement: Next week each child will bring home the Acceptable Use Agreement for ICT. Students need to bring back a signed permission form before they will be able to access computers and iPads in the school. The document outlines the expectations of behaviour when using the internet. Please go through this with your child as you sign it. Please return as soon as possible so that we can start using ICT in classrooms, as they are intended.

Police Message “Operation School’s Back”: Local Police, together with members of the Highway Patrol, are running an operation to mark the start of the school year. “Operation School’s Back” will target the safety of students arriving and departing school with the major focus being the enforcement of the 40kmph school zones. Motorists are asked to be vigilant before and after school as there will be increased pedestrian, road and pushbike traffic. Please allow an extra 5 minutes to find a safe and legal park to ensure your children’s safety. For those motorists driving through school zones please adhere to the speed limit and be aware of staffed school crossings. Failing to stop/remain stationary at school crossing is a \$379 fine and 3 demerit points. Stopped-Double parked is a \$91 fine and Exceed speed limit by 10kmph but less than 15kmph is a \$303 fine and 3 demerit points. This is just an example of some of the fines.

Supervision After School: As you may be aware, there is a park on the corner of Coburns Road and West Melton Drive, where a number of students wait for their parents afterschool. Please be aware that the school is not able to provide teacher supervision in this area. I therefore suggest that you consider an alternative location at which your child waits to be picked up. Can I also remind you that we have a Before and After School care facility run by Extend that is safe and well supervised and children can attend at a minimal cost. Please contact the school if you would like further information about Extend. Enrolment Packs are available at the office.

Welcome back Melton West Community!!

This year, we will be making some changes in how our students see and feel about food.

At snack time, students will be able to only purchase healthy options (a few options would be frozen yogurt, frozen fruits, or pizza rolls) from the canteen. The more sugar your child eats during the morning or early in the day, will affect how they are able to focus and learn. At lunch, students will be able to buy items like icy poles, chips, etc. Have your child be involved with the choices! If your child is buying their snacks and lunches, ask your child what healthy choice they made that day.
