Welcome back to the school for the final term of the year. As always, it will be a big one, with lots of things planned across the school. The 1/2 students will have their long awaited Sleepover at the end of the term. We have a swimming program available for all students from Prep to Year 6, with each year level going for a week at a time. We also have the School Fete on Friday 21st October, so put that date in your diary, we look forward to seeing you there. Another major task during term 4 is the formation of classes for 2017. This is quite a complicated process, so please check the critical dates listed later in this newsletter if you have any queries or concerns regarding your child's grade placement in 2017.

valuable time together as a young family.

Staff Selection for 2017: At the moment we are in the process of selecting staff for 2017. The majority of our staff is ongoing, which guarantees them a position here to work with our school community. Some teachers are on a contract because they took over from someone who left during the year, or someone who left last year but may come back if the position they are in at the other school is no longer available. Our aim, when recruiting, is always to get the best possible teacher available at the time. It is a long and arduous process, but one we take seriously.

effective allocation of resources maximises student learning outcomes. Thank-you to the parents who returned the questionnaire she handed out or she spoke to. Your opinions are valued. Gerry's report is complete and has recommendations we can use as we move into creating our 2017 AIP and will provide a snapshot of our school we can use as part of our School Review in 2017.

Assembly Term 4: During term 4, as the weather starts to warm up, we always change the starting time of our Friday Assemblies to 9.00am, before the sun gets too warm in the afternoon. Please come along and join us for this important weekly celebration of students and their achievements.



No Hat No Play: We have a Sun Smart policy which outlines when hats need to be worn outside during recess and lunch and during sport held outside. I have attached a copy with this

newsletter for your information. Please ensure your child has a school approved royal blue, broad-brimmed hat, available at Lowes at Woodgrove Shopping Centre before Monday or they will be directed under a shady area by the yard duty teachers, for their protection from the sun.

Art Show: It was our intention this year to start alternating our annual School Concert with an Art Show. Unfortunately, due to a number of reasons, this will not be possible this year and it is too late to start the plans to hold a concert. We will endeavour to have either an Art Show or a School Concert in 2017.

2017 Preparations: We are about to begin the process of forming new class grouping for 2017. In order to know how many classes we will need, I have attached a tear off section to complete if your child WILL NOT be returning to Melton West PS in 2017. Seasons for Growth': Supporting students through grief, separation and loss. EXPRESSIONS OF INTERESTS: TERM 4, 2016.

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives. At Melton West Primary School, we recognise that when changes occur in families through death, separation, divorce or other related circumstances of loss, children may benefit from learning how to manage these changes more effectively. We are therefore keen to offer a very successful education program called Seasons for Growth. This program is facilitated in small groups and is based on research highlighting the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The program focuses on issues such as self-esteem, managing feelings, problem solving skills, decision making, effective communication and support networks. We are currently in the process of organising two programs to run in term 4 involving groups of students from Years Prep to Year 6. Groupings will be P-2 and 3-6, both commencing the 2nd week of term 4. The program will run on a weekday during school hours and will consist of 10 sessions with each session the duration of a normal school period.

If you think your child would benefit from the Seasons for Growth program, we would encourage you to talk to him or her about participating. If you would like further information, or would like to register your interest please contact either Marg Campbell, Welfare or Jeffrey Knolder Well-Being Teacher Staff and Student Support. Some parents have already expressed an interest for their children to participate. Groups are limited to 6 students per group hence only 12 students can participate so please return permission forms a.s.a.p. Letters of registration will be distributed during Week 10 of this term and must be returned by Monday 3rd October which is week 1 of Term 4. Letters of confirmation including dates and times of Season sessions will be sent home during end of week 1 and beginning of week 2 of Term 4. The first sessions for Prep to Yr 6, will begin in Week 2 of Term 4.
