

School Council Elections/Nominations: School councils play a key role in Victorian government schools, and being a member of the school council is a rewarding and challenging experience. Acting as a team, council supports the principal to provide the best possible educational outcomes for students.

The functions of a school council are specified in the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 and include:

- establishing the broad direction and vision of the school within the school's community
- participating in the development and monitoring of the school strategic plan
- approving the annual budget and monitoring expenditure
- developing, reviewing and updating school policies
- raising funds for school-related purposes
- maintaining the school's grounds and buildings
- entering into contracts (such as for cleaning or construction work)
- reporting annually to the school community and to the Department
- creating interest in the school in the wider community
- informing itself of and taking into account the views of the community
- regulating and facilitating the after hours use of school premises and grounds



Head Lice: Unfortunately since returning to school after the summer holidays, head lice has continued to be an ongoing problem not only for our school but for many schools across Victoria. Sherrie Brezina, our school first aid officer, checks children's hair regularly throughout the year. She sends home notes to the family when nits or lice are found to all families in the class where they were found. She monitors the children the following morning to check children have been treated effectively. We believe this goes a long way in helping ease this ongoing, frustrating problem, however it relies on a commitment from all families to complete the entire treatment.

When hair is first treated, this usually kills any lice present, however if any nits (eggs) are not removed with a specially designed comb, they will remain in the hair and hatch between 7-10 days. Therefore it is important to recheck children's hair after one week to ensure no lice has hatched. It takes 7-10 days once the lice has hatched for them to mature enough to lay more eggs, so if they are found in the very early stages of their life, they have not yet had the opportunity to lay more eggs, therefore breaking the cycle and stopping the problem and spread amongst the community.



It takes a commitment from <u>all</u> to ensure we beat this ongoing problem. Many families do the right thing and treat their children thoroughly when they have been identified as having lice, however, this will not stop the problem unless <u>everyone</u> is committed to ensuring they treat their children effectively. A trick I learnt towards the end of my children's primary school years was to smother the dry hair with cheap conditioner then comb through with the special nit comb. I repeated this every 7 days for about a month, finally breaking the cycle. Using the conditioner ensures the comb glides through the hair easily, and the lice get stuck in the gooey substance.

Thank-you for your patience, perseverance and commitment to working as a community to help deal with this school wide problem.

Fete: Last year we cancelled the planned fete due to the inclement weather. We have decided to hold it in Term 1 on Friday 23rd March. It usually runs from 3.00 - 6.00 pm. Please mark this date in your calendar and come along and enjoy the fun.

Coles Sports Voucher: If you shop at Coles, you may have noticed them handing out Sports for Schools Vouchers. We are collecting these so if you have any please ask you child to put them in the boxes around the school.

School Council Elections - Information for Parents

WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

WHO IS ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected DET employee category members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category members are coopted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. Department employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

WHY IS PARENT MEMBERSHIP SO IMPORTANT?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. Councilors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term one each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

REMEMBER


- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.
