Thank-you to the families that came to **Meet-the-Teacher Interviews** yesterday. It was a great opportunity to speak to your child's teacher about their specific needs and any family information that may be useful in understanding and catering for your child. **Communication** is one of our school values, which we hold in high esteem. If you have any concerns and would like to talk to your child's teacher, please make an appointment to that they can give you the time you need. Teachers have meetings after school, so they will be able to find a time so it won't be rushed.

Last week I went to a meeting to discuss the next stage of the **Master Plan** design. At that stage, we were not sure whether we would get money for the project or how much. A few days later I received an email letting me know we have been given a pre-approved amount of \$6.1 million. This is fantastic news because it means the first part of the Master Plan – the PE Hall/Gym can be designed, along with new student toilets and a new Administration Block. I will keep you up-to-date with information in the newsletter as it come to hand.

I have also had some confirmation that our **School Review** will take place towards the end of term 2 and we need to prepare for this by conducting a thorough **School Self-Evaluation**. This involves getting feedback from all sectors of the community. We are very keen to hear from parents and will hold forums, send out surveys and speak directly to parents over the next few months. Your views are important to us and we would really value your perspective.

On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February we held a very special assembly for the 9<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary of Apology Day**, when the then Prime Minister, Mr Kevin Rudd tabled a motion in parliament apologising to Australia's Indigenous peoples, particularly the Stolen Generations and their families and communities, for laws and policies which had 'inflicted profound grief, suffering and loss on these our fellow Australians'. The children were very respectful and the Student leaders played an important role.

Our current **School Council** held their last meeting on Monday night. We are calling for nominations for 4 people to fill the vacancies in the Parent Member category.
