Dear Parents and Guardians,

when parents/carers work with the teachers and Principal Class to solve issues, we get positive results much quicker than if we are expressing differing views about how to deal with situations. One of a parent's biggest concern is around 'bullying'. We have a no tolerance approach to bullying and intervene as soon as we become aware of any problems. In saying this, however, it takes us longer to restore student relationships when students decide to retaliate to a situation. It would be most helpful if you could explain to your children, that instead of reacting they should inform a teacher so that the incident can be investigated and strategies put in place. The best way to deal with an on-going bullying issue is through a Restorative Conversation facilitated by a teacher. This provides children with the opportunity to tell the other person how their behaviour is affecting them. This gives the child a real sense of being heard and for the other child to make amends if appropriate. At times, when I have personally facilitated these discussions, children have come out with a heartfelt apology, genuinely expressing sorrow and remorse about how their behaviour has impacted another person. This strategy was highlighted in the ABC Show which aired last night called 'Bullied'. It is important for all adults supporting the child to remain calm and open to hearing the child's point of view. Please let us know if your child is having issues with another child, as we would like to be able to deal with this as appropriate. Sometimes children do not open up to staff at school, so we often rely on their parents to let us know.

Following on from this, ongoing Communication at our school is important to us. We like to hear about what you think we are doing well, what you're happy with and how your child is going, but most importantly, we want to hear from you when something is not going as expected. We find, at times, when parents finally do approach us, they have a long list of things they are concerned about, often dating back a few years. By not speaking up when an issue first arises it is difficult for us to respond, change or explain why things are done a certain way. Please provide us with feedback, we want to hear from our community.

Retirement: Mrs Haber informed me earlier this week that she is retiring from teaching at the end of this term. Currently she is our longest serving staff member, who has been at the school since 1984. Maryanne has educated many, many children over the years with great passion and dedication. She has had many roles whilst working as a teacher including a PE teacher role. We wish Maryanne all the best as she ventures into the next phase of her life and thank her for the work and commitment she has shown here at with an adult. Melton West PS.

Annual Report to Community Meeting: The Annual Report to Community Meeting which will be held on Monday 27th March. Please feel free to attend this meeting if you would like to hear about the 2016 Annual Report or alternatively, copies of the Annual Report will be available at the office after 27th March and will be published on our website after this date.

Professional Learning: On Tuesday we held a Curriculum Day around the teaching of maths, specifically around having a whole school approach to Problem Solving and Number Sense. Teachers and aides spoke about the importance of having a seamless, whole school approach which should eliminate gaps in children's mathematical knowledge, helping them to be fluent by the time they reach secondary school. When we talk about fluency in maths, it's about knowing the 10 number facts, doubles, the multiplication tables and being able to recall them in an efficient way so they can be used to help us solve a problem. This day was facilitated by the Numeracy Consultant, Ms Christine Botheras, who has been working with us since last year. She has a good understanding of how we teach maths and works with teachers to ensure there is consistency across the school.

Masterplan: We continue to welcome various people to our school who are doing tasks such as soil tests, storm water drain checking, etc which I take as a positive sign that the Masterplan is developing. I will continue to keep you up to date as we get further information and/or confirmation of funding,

which, I believe, could be part of the State Budget in May.

Blocking Neighbours Driveways: I had word last week that some people are parking awkwardly whilst dropping off or waiting for their children, including blocking our neighbours' driveways. Please be respectful of their right to enter and leave their property at all times. Remember the Council encourages families to park at the Melton Waves, cross at the supervised crossing on Coburns Road and walk the short distance to school. We support their plan and encourage children to take this option to get some exercise as part of their day.

Corner Milk Bar: Our canteen is required to be quite strict with the type of food they sell, limiting high fat and sugary foods. This is a requirement from the Education Department. The goodies they have on sale have been carefully vetted by the company, ensuring any muffins, cakes and other goodies are of the highest quality. We have a number of students who visit the milk bar at the end of the street purchasing lollies, soft drink, including high energy drinks. Some children even leave the school grounds before school after their parents have watched them enter the school grounds, which is very unsafe. From Monday, we will be banning children from consuming any food bought from the milk bar. It will be taken from them and returned at the end of the day, unless it is accompanied by a permission note from a parent. If you give your child money to spend at the canteen, please talk to them about not spending it at the shop. Your support in this matter is most appreciated.

Meeting Children Afterschool: We will be asking parents to wait for their children outside the buildings. Please choose a spot with your child where they can meet you and/or wait for you. Having parents and carers in the corridors at the end of the day can make the exiting of the building quite hectic. Part of our role as educators is to build independence in the children and this is one way that we can help them.

Other important information for this newsletter:

Camps, Sports and Excursion Funds (CSEF): Students of families, who have an eligible Health Care Card, can apply for a grant from the Government of \$125. Please bring your current Health Care Card to the office and complete the form.

Extend OSHC: We have a Before and After School Care Program that families are encouraged to use if they need to get their child to school very early – before 8.30 or need care afterschool. Yard duty finishes at 3.15 each day, so children should be cleared from the playground by then, unless they are with an adult.

ICT Acceptable Use Agreement: earlier in the term each child brought home the Acceptable Use Agreement for ICT. Students need to bring back a signed permission form before they will be able to access computers and iPads in the school. The document outlines the expectations of behaviour when using the internet. Please go thought this with your child as you sign it. Please return as soon as possible so that we can start using ICT in classrooms, as they are intended.

Supervision After School: As you may be aware, there is a park on the corner of Coburns Road and West Melton Drive, where a number of students wait for their parents afterschool. Please be aware that the school is not able to provide teacher supervision in this area. I therefore suggest that you consider an alternative location at which your child waits to be picked up. Can I also remind you that we have a Before and After School care facility run by Extend that is safe and well supervised and children can attend at a minimal cost. Please contact the school if you would like further information about Extend. Enrolment Packs are available at the office. We have staff on yard duty before school from 8.40 am and afterschool until 3.20 pm.
