Dear Parents and Guardians,

End Term 1 Celebrations: As I write this newsletter, my final for term 1, I reflect on everything that has gone well on 2019. Our swimming program was changed from term 3 to term 1 and I think this has been positive. The children who attended enjoyed their experience and the weather was very kind. We have held our Community Engagement Evenings across the school, some better attended than others, unfortunately. For those who attended, we hope you found a deeper understanding of the work we do and your children's learning opportunities. Our Teaching and Learning coaching program is up and running, with teachers continually learning and developing. As educators, we are continual learners, learning something every day. The research around effective teaching practice is always evolving and as such, we need to ensure we are evolving, changing and adapting along with it.

Master Plan/Building Works: We are marching along with the building works, which are all on schedule. It is so exciting seeing the foundations laid and seeing it starting to take shape. It is a REALITY. When speaking to people who have been associated with the school for a long time, including some who have since left, they all talk about how getting a full-sized gym has been a dream for over 20 years.

Rebranding Melton West PS: As part of the building works, the address will change to Rathdowne Circuit, where the entry to the school will be relocated, which means our stationary needs to be updated with the new address. School Council thought it would be a perfect opportunity to look at whether we should look at rebranding our school. I will send out a survey early next term, which will be able to be completed online and in paper form, whichever you prefer. We will also set up a working party made up of interested parents and staff, which I encourage you to think about joining us. Any changes that are decided, need to be made through extensive consultation with our community and approved by School Council.

SVA Conference: Over the past few days, Mrs Cvitkovic, Mrs O'Connor and I attended the first of the final 4 SVA Conferences. Our commitment to this network was a 3 year commitment and this is our final year of involvement. We continue to meet and learn from educators from across Victoria, NSW and SA and have found that it has opened many opportunities for us as a school.

Speaking to Other Children: At times I know some parents feel the need to talk to a child who may be upsetting their own child, with the intention of helping ease the situation. This is **NOT** an acceptable practice at Melton West PS. If you have any concerns about another child, please ensure you speak to your child's teacher who can follow up and address the situation. It can be very frightening for a child to feel they are getting reprimanded by an adult other than their parent or a teacher. If you have any concerns or feel the situation is not being resolved with the class teacher, please make an appointment to see Mrs O'Connor P-2 Assistant Principal, Mrs Kathy Cvitkovic 3-6 Assistant Principal or myself. We are committed to working together to resolve all issues brought to our attention.

Respectful Behaviours: At Melton West PS we have put a lot of strategies and supports in place to develop the social and emotional needs of students and to help children manage their response when things don't go the way they expect such as:

- Kids Connect Program a social skills lesson held weekly or fortnightly with a small group of students where they learn to manage their emotions, take turns, share and find other ways to respond when they are angry.
- Resilience Groups a weekly session where children learn about dealing with issues in a more positive and proactive way, learning how to get along with their peers and respond in a more appropriate way.
- Drumbeat a weekly session where children learn to regulate their emotions and develop a mutual respect for their peers through drumming
- Berry Street PD all staff have participated in 4 full training days on how to support children experiencing trauma.
- Library at Lunch is open every day at recess and lunch as a quiet space for children to read and engage in board games

Attendance: It is very important that children attend school EVERY day. Attendance is one of our school focuses for 2019 and we are trying very hard to help children understand that being at school, learning, is the most important thing they can do to get the results they need to be successful into their future. At 10.30 am each day an automated text message gets sent to the parent listed as Parent A informing them that their child is not at school. It is important that your contact details are kept up-to-date whenever there is a change, or a late pass is collected for any children arriving after 9.00 am.
