Reading

At the beginning of the year the Preps were engaged in the first 20 of reading, where they set up classroom libraries and learnt about the different aspects of a reading lesson. Throughout the term students have engaged in class discussions, read alouds, turn and talks, conferences, learning centres and oral language experiences to support and extend their beginning reading behaviours. Later on in the term students developed their Previewing and Predicting skills by using their prior knowledge and looking at the illustrations of a text.

Writing

This term in writing, Prep students have engaged in the first 20 days of writing, learnt how to orally recount an experience and participated in the Grade 4 Buddy program creating a classroom book every week. Throughout the first 20 days of the term, Prep students worked on setting up the routines and expectations of good writers and learnt about what a writing session looks like. During our writing sessions, students engage in investigation stations for the first part of the session. Through investigative play, students have been building their world knowledge and vocabulary, which supports both their reading and writing development. After the first 20 days of writing, Prep students engaged in a recount unit learning how to orally recount an experience using the 4 W's; who, what, where and when. This term we also started Grade 4 buddies, where once a week Prep students and their Grade 4 buddy engaged in an oral language experience and wrote about what they did with their buddy, creating a classroom big book.

Mathematics

This term in maths, students began the term by learning about the maths equipment in their classroom and how they use it in maths. The preps also learnt about patterns where they learnt how to represent, continue and create simple patterns using materials. They then learnt about shapes where they had to identify simple shapes in their environment and sort shapes by their common and distinctive features. Students then worked on matching individual objects with counting sequences up to and back from 20. Lastly the preps will spend the last week of term on length where they will compare and explain the length of objects.

Inquiry

This term in Inquiry, students have been exploring two different units of work, 'Learning to Learn' and 'Squeaky Clean'. As a class, students set up classroom expectations and procedures and unpacked the Melton West School Wide Positive Behaviour Matrix. Later in the term students moved onto exploring 'Squeaky Clean'. Students participated in tasks such as a germ experiment where they could see all the germs on their hands using glitter and dirt, sequencing tasks around their hygiene routine and tasks that demonstrated the importance of cleaning their bodies. At the end of the term students invited parents to an Inquiry Showcase, where they created a daily hygiene schedule to use at home.

ART




