It's a great opportunity for parents, with their pre-school children, to come to socialise with other parents and young children. It also helps the young children feel comfortable in the school environment. Communication is key to developing successful relationships and we are very keen to ensure we keep the lines of communication open at all times. If you have a question or concern that you'd like to talk to your child's teacher about, it is best to make an appointment with them. Staff meeting nights are Tuesday and Wednesday so all staff have a commitment on these nights. Please also be aware that from 8.50 am in the morning staff need to be attentive to the children as they enter the room, so that is not a good time. Making an appointment ensures everyone is tuned into the issue at hand and can give it their full attention.

Child Safety Standards: At Melton West Primary School, we are committed to acting in the best interests of our students and keeping them safe from harm. The School regards its child protection responsibilities as being of the utmost importance. This means that in practice we are focussed on providing the necessary resources to ensure compliance with all relevant child protection legislation and regulations; and to maintaining a child safe culture.

The following principles underpin our commitment to child safety at Melton West Primary School:


- All students deserve, as a fundamental right, safety and protection from all forms of abuse and neglect.
- Our school works in partnership with families and the community to ensure that they are engaged in decision-making processes, particularly those that have an impact on child safety and protection.
- All students have the right to a thorough and systematic education in all aspects of personal safety, in partnership with their parents/guardians/caregivers.
- All adults in our school, including teaching and non-teaching staff, volunteers and contractors as well as the broader school community have a responsibility to care for children and young people, to positively promote their wellbeing and to protect them from any kind of harm or abuse.
- The policies, guidelines and codes of conduct for the care, wellbeing and protection of students are based on honest, respectful and trusting relationships between adults and children and young people.
- Policies and practices demonstrate compliance with legislative requirements and cooperation with governments, the police and human services agencies.
- All persons involved in situations where harm is suspected or disclosed must be treated with sensitivity, dignity and respect.
- Staff, volunteers, contractors, parents/guardians and students should feel free to raise concerns about child safety, knowing these will be taken seriously by school leadership.
- Appropriate confidentiality will be maintained, with information being provided to those who have a right or a need to be informed, either legally or pastorally.

Melton West Primary School is committed to the continuous improvement of our Child Safe Program. The Program is regularly reviewed for overall effectiveness and to ensure compliance with all child protection related laws, regulations and standards. Our Child Safe Policy is available from the office and on our website. Please make an appointment to speak to a member of the Principal Class Team if you have any concerns about a child's safety.

Mobile Phone Policy 2020: As you may be away, the Minister of Education announced last year that from 2020 mobile phones are banned from being used in schools. I have included the current policy with this newsletter, which is also available on the School Website. The guidelines say that the phones should be securely stored if brought to school, and the office area can ensure they are safe. If you have any concerns or believe your child needs to be granted an exemption please make an appointment at the office to discuss this with me.

Meet the Teacher Interviews: On Wednesday 19th February we invite all parents and carers to a "Getting to Know My Child" Parent-Teacher Interview. This is an opportunity for you to talk to the teachers about your child so that they can best meet the needs of your child. Please take the opportunity to attend, even if it's just to introduce yourself.

Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?



Whole School Focus on Reading: Each year I like to share with the School Community the importance of reading at home with your child. An interesting fact about the amount of time children read outside of school makes a huge difference to their reading over time. I have included a visual representation that outlines the more children read at home, the more exposure they get to new words, which helps them with their overall learning by developing an extensive vocabulary.

Attendance: As we are aware, children need to be at school all day every day for them to reach their full potential. We are continuing our major focus on attendance this year with a specific focus on late arrivals and early leavers. There are often important messages disseminated in the classroom at the start and end of the day and it can be very unsettling for

students to miss these. It can also be very hard for children to enter a classroom when all children are settled and working, worried that they will become the centre of attention as children watch them enter. Please ensure children are here before 8.50 and make appointments for children to attend after 3.05 wherever possible. An automated message gets sent to all parents whose children have not attended school and we have not been notified by 10.30 am. Please ensure your contact details are kept up to date by contacting the office. If your child arrives AFTER 9.00 am, they will need to collect a late pass from the office. Staff will make contact with you if your child is absent and we have not been informed. Please be patient with us if you get multiple phone calls. We care about your children and want them at school.

Swimming Program: This term, all students have the opportunity to participate in our annual swimming program. Notes went home this week and payments are being collected at the moment. Please take this opportunity to send your child to swimming lessons at the local Melton Waves Swimming Pool. We received constructive feedback about the program last year and have worked very closely with the pool to improve their service and the experience for the children. If you attend any of the lessons and have any feedback, positive or negative, I would be most interested in hearing it, so we can ensure we give our children the most fantastic swimming program they deserve.

MELTON WEST PRIMARY SCHOOL MOBILE PHONE POLICY

NOTE: On 26 June 2019 the Minister for Education announced mobile phones will be banned for all student at Victorian state primary and secondary schools from Term 1 2020, with some exceptions. Our Mobile Device Policy will be updated when this new policy comes into effect in Term 1 next year.

1. PURPOSE

To explain to our school community Melton West Primary School's policy requirements, and expectations regarding the safe and appropriate use of personal mobile devices by students, at school or during school activities.

2. POLICY STATEMENT

This policy applies to:

- 1. All students at Melton West Primary School and,
- 2. All personal mobile devices that have not been approved by Melton West Primary School and/or classroom teacher for the purpose of carrying out and engaging in the teaching and learning of the curriculum.

Personal mobile devices are portable computing and communication devices such as smartphones, and smart watches.

3. IMPLEMENTATION

Melton West Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile device to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school or to extra-curricular activities.

- During school hours, personal mobile devices must be switched off, and locked securely in the school office. Phones are to be handed in to the office in the morning and collected at the end of the day.
- Students are not permitted to access their personal mobile devices during lunchtime or recess, unless they have sought and been granted an exemption to this Policy by the Principal.
- If students are found to have devices in their possession these will be confiscated and stored securely at the school office. Students can pick the device up at the office at the end of the school day.

Personal mobile devices must not be used:

- during class or assemblies or in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets,

Students who use their personal mobile device inappropriately at school may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's *Student Wellbeing and Engagement* and/or *Bullying* policies.

Students are responsible for their personal mobile device. Please note that the Melton West Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items, including personal mobile devices that may be brought to school. Students are responsible for items brought to school.

In most circumstances, students will not be allowed to bring their personal mobile device on overnight school camps or excursions. Melton West Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can be brought to special activities and events, including personal mobile device.
