Dear Parents and Guardians,

I begin this newsletter with an update on the Coronaviurus/Covid 19 situation. I get regular updates from the Department, which reflect the Department of Health advice. I know the threat of this virus is concerning to many in our community because they are concerned about exposing older or unwell relatives to the virus if their child inadvertently caught it at school, however the advice from the Department is that unless a child has had direct exposure to a confirmed case all children should attend school as per usual. Current advice includes that the Commonwealth Government has updated travel restrictions this week. The extension to existing travel restrictions now applies to visitors from Republic of Korea, Iran and mainland China. Visitors who are not Australian citizens or permanent residents, or their dependants, will not be allowed entry into Australia. The Commonwealth Government has also advised that visitors from Italy will also be subject to enhanced health screening and temperature testing arrangements. Some of our students and families may be affected by the travel advice, and I'd encourage you to support each other. Everyone can protect against infections by practising good hand and respiratory hygiene. Here are some tips that we all can follow:

- 1. Cover your mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing with a tissue, or cough into your elbow.
- 2. Dispose of the tissue into a bin and then wash your hands afterwards.
- 3. Wash your hands regularly using soap and water, including after using the toilet, and before eating.

Unofficial Opening: Due to the weather forecast and the predicted showers and thunderstorms occurring in the afternoon, we have decided to postpone this event until early Term 2. Details of a future date will be relayed to the school community as soon as it is finalised.

School Crossing Supervisor Nomination: I was recently informed that nominations are currently being received for the School Crossing Supervisor of the Year. These awards give people the chance to reward the active role the supervisors play in the safety of school children. Seven finalist from around the State will be chosen. Nominations are open until 8th May and can be found on the following website www.schoolcrossingsvictoria.com.au The supervisors that keep our children safe are Pam on Rathdowne Circuit, Carol on West Melton Drive and Susan on Coburns Road.

Swimming: Next week the Year 1/2s are attending swimming, with the Preps attending the following week. Their lessons are from 11.30am - 1.45pmfor 1/2's and 11.30am - 1.00pm for the Preps. Your child's teacher will inform you via Dojo of the exact time if you wish to attend. Please remember the children are supervised by school staff and the pool staff, so if you have any concerns you need to speak to one of them, not to any other child.

Dreams for Your Child: Thank you to the parents who completed the tear off slip in the last newsletter asking for your Hopes and Dreams for your child as they started school. We are interested in hearing from a wider range of people so please feel free to complete it and send to the office. I will collate the findings and share with the community early in term 2.

Resilience Meeting with ACT: This week we had an open invitation for any parents interested in hearing about how they can help develop resilience in their child. The meeting was facilitated by the Australian Childhood Trauma Group and was well received by the parents who attended. Please look out for future session that will be held from 2.00pm— 3.00pm.

Chinese Incursion: Next Friday we are hosting Asia Raya, a dance company that will share a range of Chinese cultural experiences, such as dance, puppetry etc. Please encourage your child to attend as it greatly supports the learning of our LOTE program.

Harmony Day Incursion: Harmony Day is on the 21st March each year, which happens to fall on a Saturday. We have arranged for an incursion on Thursday 26th March called Yarn Bark, which provides exposure to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Culture and History. This is a very worthwhile experience and we encourage all children to attend.

School Photos: Each year families have the opportunity to purchase a School Photo of their child. This year School Photo Day is on Thursday 19th March. All children have received an envelope to order their photo if they wish. It is common practice across all schools for everyone to have their photo taken REGARDLESS if the families are purchasing any prints. If you DO NOT wish for your child's photo to be taken as part of the School Photos please let the office know as soon as possible so we can ensure they are not part of the class photo.




