English

Reading—Prep students will be practising the reading comprehension skill of 'visualising', where they create images in their head while reading a text. Students use words and images to describe what they can see, hear, smell, taste and feel (physically and emotionally). Students will continue to learn letter names and sounds and high-frequency words, knowing these words by sight enables students to confidently read texts then use other strategies (like looking at the picture or using the initial sound) to read more challenging words. Students are encouraged to continue independent reading by using books on Epic.





Writing– Prep students are learning about 'Narratives' and their features. They will need to retell well known narratives by describing the events in order using characters' names and the setting. Role playing is a key aspect of learning narratives where students will act out events from the stories using puppets. While they do this they use images from the text to remind them of the events. Students will also be developing their writing skills by structuring sentences with a capital letter at the beginning, a full stop at the end and spaces between words. Daily handwriting practise and writing known high frequency words in sentences are other skills that will help build confidence and independence as writers.

Speaking and Listening—Prep students are continuing to develop their phonological skills through practising identifying the beginning (dog starts with /d) and ending sounds (dog ends with /g) of words and progressing to breaking small words into all of their sounds (dog = d/o/g). Students are also learning about respectful relationships using speaking and listening exercises to discuss a range of emotions and problem solve different situations in order to get along with others.



In Mathematics, prep students will be engaged in learning addition and subtraction, the skills focus on having two or more small amounts and a total. 'Hands on tasks' have been designed for students to manipulate materials to separate whole amounts into parts for exploring addition and subtraction concepts. Students are also learning about capacity and how to compare different containers and work out which ones hold more or less than others. They are also gathering a range of data/information and showing these on displays, such as table or picture graphs. They will then use this data to answer yes/no questions. Students are encouraged to also engage in Mathletics and complete tasks set by their teacher.





100 DAYS OF SCHOOL— 10th August


Prep students will be celebrating 100 days of school virtually this year.

Class Dojo and WebEx

Class Dojo continues to be the main communication platform during remote and flexible learning.
